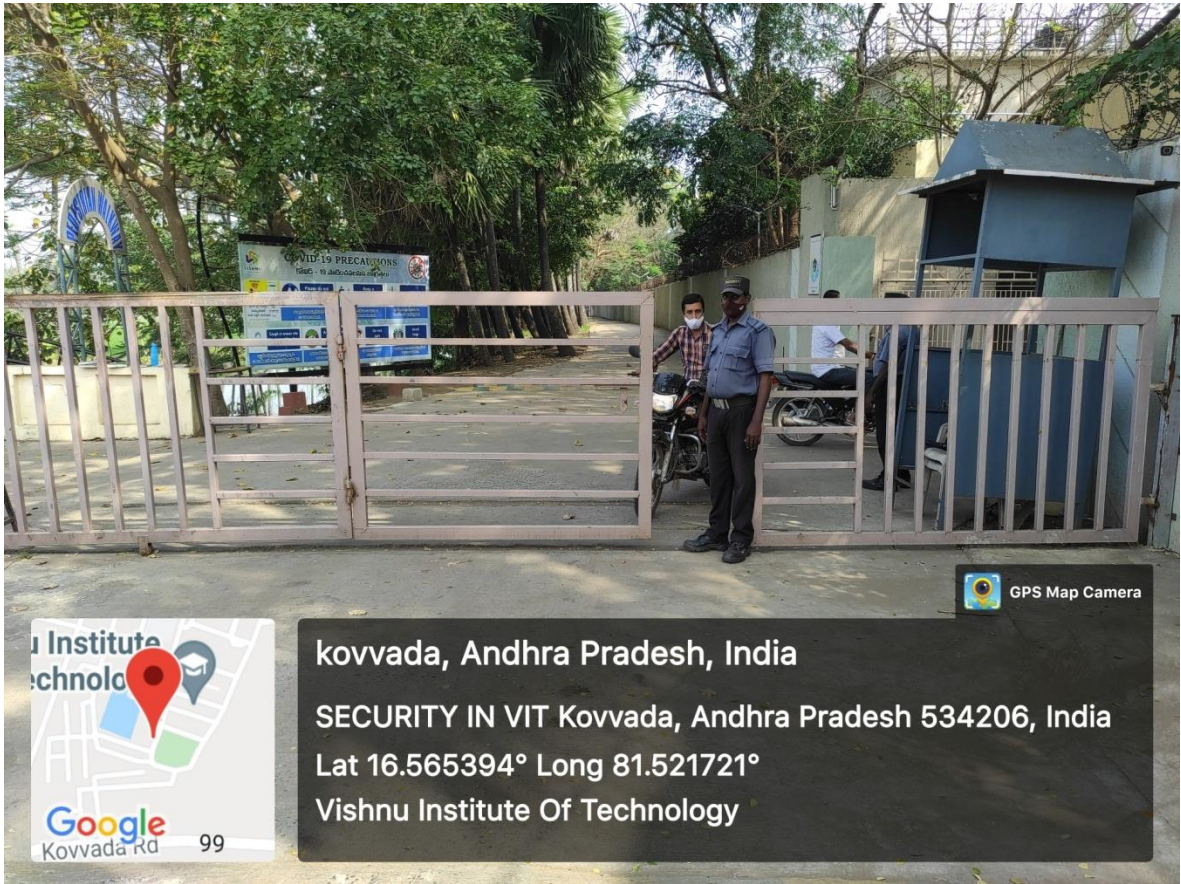

3. Pedestrian-friendly pathways



Sidewalks and walkways are “pedestrian lanes” that **provide people with space to travel within the public right-of-way** that is separated from roadway vehicles. They provide places for children to walk, run, skate, ride bikes, and play. A buffer zone of 4 to 6 feet is desirable to separate pedestrians from the street.

The minimum width for a walkway is 48 inches (121.9 cm), which allows for two pedestrians to walk side by side comfortably. It is recommended, however, to increase the width if possible in high use public areas to at least 72 inches (182.88 cm).

Near Canal gate of the Campus a Pedestrian walk way facility as a Foot Over bridge across the Canal is Provided for the Students & Staff Mobility.
